MESSAGE FROM OUR POTENTATE

As we are now entering the end of our first quarter for 2019, I would have to say that “Mighty” Moslem is really making strides in the right direction. We have, and will continue to look for, cost cutting initiatives needed to reduce non-fixed expenditures, we have made great progress in our membership drive this year, and our fundraisers have been very successful. While there are always, shall we say, bumps in the road, I would be remiss if I didn’t express that I have had a fantastic time so far and the support has been truly phenomenal. My thanks to all those that are helping Moslem Shrine succeed.

In terms of membership, we are definitely moving in the right direction. At the time of this article being written, we have raised 17 new Nobles, 8 Master Masons waiting to join, and 1 affiliate member. That’s 26 as of March 15th. With each Unit and Club being tasked with bringing in 10 new Nobles and with the “score card” being publicized every month in the Moslemite, everyone will have the opportunity to see where they are ranked. Personally, I would not want to be ranked last at the end of the year.... For those Nobles that have not traveled to their Blue Lodges recently, I would also ask that if your schedule allows, that you do so and make them aware of our membership opportunity this year of joining for \$100.00. It is a fantastic value at that price so all you need to do is communicate – tell them of our fraternity and our philanthropy.

We have had two highly successful fundraisers - the Sportsman’s Raffle and the Moslem Shrine Circus. The Sportsman’s raffle had a huge turnout with an estimated 6000 people in attendance and the Shrine Circus was, and these are not my words, “totally reinvented” into a must-see event. Between the venue itself, the 3-rings, the acts, and the volunteers, we sold out more than a few shows and the opportunities to improve and to grow are staggering.

While I have brought this up in the past, I think it’s important to keep this message going: I ask each one of you to take the time to meet with those in other Units and Clubs, to travel to one of “our” Hospitals if you are able, and to take stock in your surroundings and ask yourself “what can I do to make Moslem better.” If you have an idea to improve our Temple, let it be known. If you have an idea for a new Unit or Club, bring it to the Divan and we will work together to see if we can make it a reality.

For the Ladies of Moslem Shrine, I once again thank you for all that you do to support us and our activities. Your presence and dedication does not go unnoticed.

To quell any rumors with regards to Shriners Hospitals for Children – Cincinnati, please accept the following information as released by Shriners International, Tampa.

Shriners Hospitals for Children – Cincinnati announces potential move to Dayton Children’s Hospital

Shriners Hospitals for Children is excited to announce that we have entered into a memorandum of understanding to relocate our Cincinnati-based hospital to within Dayton Children’s Hospital. Once binding legal documents are fully executed, we anticipate that the relocation will occur within the following 16 months, with our first patient day at Dayton Children’s to occur in the summer of 2020.

The relocated Shriners Hospital will lease and occupy its own space and purchase certain services from Dayton Children’s, and will operate as a separate and distinct hospital, within another hospital. We plan to renovate Dayton Children’s former pediatric intensive care unit and one operating room to meet the needs of our patient population. Renovation is expected to start in June and will take approximately one year to complete.

Shriners Hospitals for Children — Cincinnati was established in the mid-1960s in response to a lack of pediatric burn care, and provides care for burn injuries and reconstructive and plastic surgery, as well as cleft lip and palate care. It is one of four locations within the Shriners health care system that offers care for burn injuries and related conditions. The hospital is known for its knowledge and skill in this field and has provided care for children from all over the world. However, over time, the severity and frequency of pediatric burn injuries has declined in the United States. And, as is true in many other areas of medical treatment, many procedures for these injuries have shifted from an inpatient to an outpatient setting. Repositioning our Cincinnati hospital within Dayton Children’s will allow us to continue to deliver high-quality burn care and other services in a space that meets the needs of our patients today more appropriately, economically and efficiently. As an organization that relies on the generosity of our donors, we must be good and conscientious stewards of resources, including our facilities’ physical size and area. We also expect to gain operational efficiencies by purchasing some services from Dayton Children’s.

The move to Dayton Children’s also makes it possible for Shriners Hospitals for Children to maintain its presence in southwest Ohio and continue to provide its local patients throughout its eight-state catchment area with regional access to burn care and reconstructive surgery services, while also offering care to children wherever they may live.

“Dayton Children’s has worked closely with Shriners Cincinnati on several projects recently and greatly value their mission,” says Deborah A. Feldman, president and CEO of Dayton Children’s Hospital. “I am pleased to welcome them to Dayton Children’s main campus and support them in continuing to provide dedicated services in burn and reconstructive surgical care.”

In summary, the Cincinnati Shriners Hospital will relocate to within Dayton Children’s Hospital, but will operate completely separate and apart from Dayton Children’s in compliance with the relevant legal and statutory requirements. This concept enables the Shriners Hospital to continue to deliver high-quality burn and reconstructive surgical care to its patients while achieving operational efficiencies through purchasing ancillary and physician services from Dayton Children’s and others that would be inefficient to duplicate (for example, lab services).

“We appreciate and are grateful for the dedication and commitment of our Cincinnati staff to the mission of Shriners Hospitals for Children, and we are proud of the hospital’s many contributions to the field of burn care over the past 50 years,” said Jim Cain, chairman of the board of directors of Shriners Hospitals for Children. “We look forward to this new relationship with Dayton Children’s Hospital and continuing to provide hope and healing to the children who depend on us. We are very excited about the next chapter in the history of our unique health care system.”

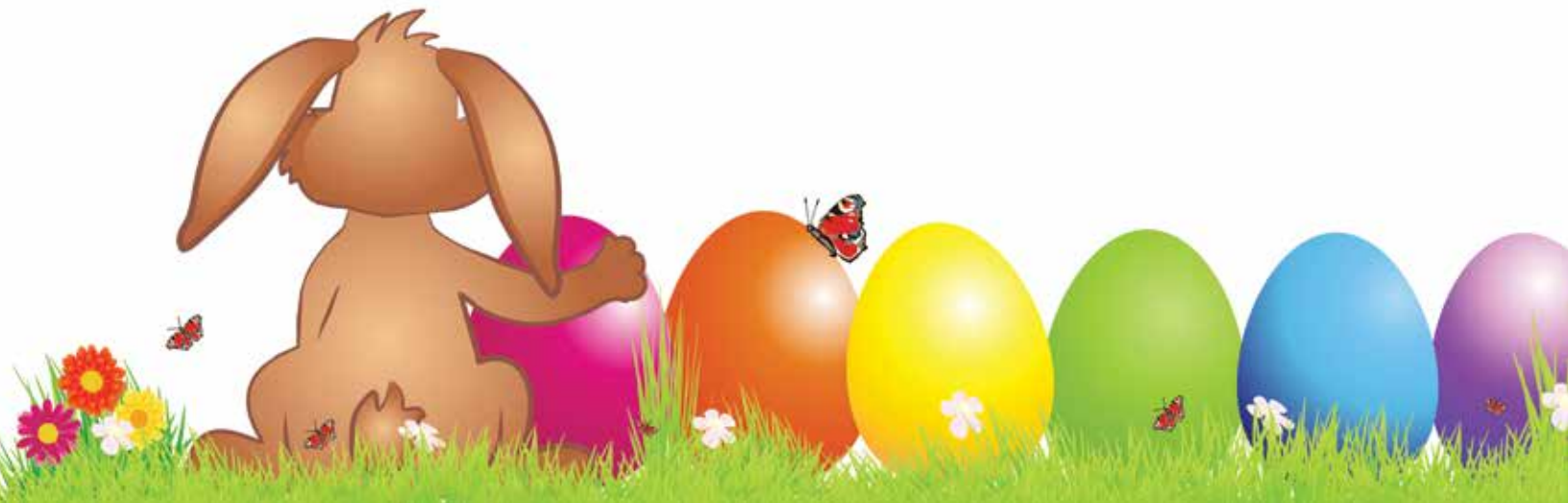

MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAPLAIN

Hello Nobles,

I would like to take a moment now that I have had a little bit of time to say thank you. When approached to hold this distinguished appointment I was a bit apprehensive. First and foremost, to me this is a great honor to be asked to be Chaplain of Moslem Temple. To follow a Noble who has held this appointment for as long as he had (my predecessor the Chaplain Emeritus Noble Scott) I was unsure if I could perform the task to the quality that it had been performed previously.

When I first became a Mason in Allen Park Key Lodge I was told that if I was to take a chair in the line of officers that it was stepping above the normal commitments of a member. That more would be expected of you because of the commitment you would be making when you made the choice to serve. To serve and help others is what motivates me, it is what I was taught when young and in the tradition of generations of my family I also went into the service and honorably served for 9 years.

Being around the active Divan has been an eye opener. I believe as a Noble that I did not understand the time commitment alone that they put in. It reminds me of being Master of Detroit No. 2. As Master, I had the privilege of sitting in the East for what turned out to be basically two years due to circumstances with the previous sitting Master. I learned a lot about commitments to the Fraternity and to the Lodge as well as to the members, but one of the most important lessons I learned was after I stepped out of the East. What I learned was where as Master I had failed. Some would say that if you raised 35 new Brothers and had 15 more transfer into the Lodge then turned another 28 Brothers in various degrees over to the incoming Master that you didn't fail. The most important lesson I learned was what it meant to be a Brother. It took 11 Officers and several Brothers volunteering to achieve those numbers. It was not done by me alone. I failed to realize that my commitment went beyond making it to the East. I failed those who followed by not making sure that they were prepared for what was coming. I failed the Lodge in not making sure that new members understand what it meant to be a Mason and a Brother. I failed to recognize how to adapt the Lodge for the changing times and demands on its Members.

I foresee serious times in front of Moslem Temple. Times that will not only challenge the Divan, but all Nobles of our Temple. As Chaplain of Moslem Temple I feel it is my obligation to help all Nobles be prepared and to understand what it means to be a Noble of Moslem Temple. We are on the Imperial radar because of some of the work that our Nobles and volunteers have achieved. What we are not doing is looking out for the health of our membership. As Chaplain, I want to help our Nobility to understand and communicate what it means to be a Noble of Moslem Temple, what it means to be a part of something that is bigger than yourself. I want Moslem Temple to be a healthy and strong Temple that makes a positive difference wherever its members are.

Okay, that sounds nice. How do we do this and what do you mean. Let's start with a basic question to all of you. What does it mean to be a Noble of Moslem Temple. I would like you to actually write it down and return it to me. I don't care if you write it on paper, email it, turn it in to the office to give to me, whatever or however (disclaimer: within reason as I know what kind of jokesters Nobles are).

I can then begin to communicate that to others who will begin to understand how important each and every one of us is. 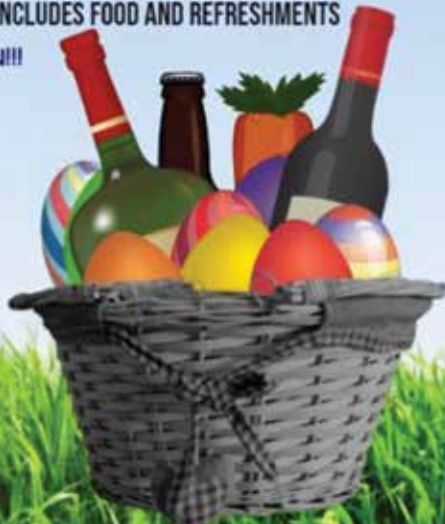


