MESSAGE FROM OUR ASSISTANT RABBAN

We've just returned from the Imperial Sessions in Nashville. Over 100 Nobles and spouses attended Imperial this year and we had a great time in fellowship and learning about what our great organization has to offer. Our new Imperial Potentate, Jeffery Sowder of Midian Temple in Wichita, Kansas has been installed. Our own Imperial Sir Larry Leib has now moved up one slot to Imperial Marshal. New patient ambassadors representing Shriners Hospitals for Children were introduced at the public relations presentation. I encourage all Nobles to try and make it to an Imperial Session because you meet so many people from other temples from across the country and learn so much more about our fraternity and philanthropy.

The 15th Annual Shriners Summer Sportsman's Raffle is Saturday, August 10th and coming up very quickly. We always need all Nobles involved in selling tickets before the event, volunteering at the event and promoting the event through conversation, social media and passing out flyers. The success of this event is 3-fold. First, it provides much needed financial resources for our temple. Second, it provides a common ground and bonding of our nobles and ladies. Third, due to the large percentage of non-Shriners attending, it showcases both our fraternity and philanthropy to help build membership and support from the outside.

I would also like to thank all the nobles that showed up at the special meeting to vote on the increase in dues in 2020. We had a very large crowd in attendance for the vote. Moslem Nobles are currently paying the lowest dues in the Great Lakes Region. After some discussion there was an affirmative vote to increase the dues, we will now be in almost the middle-of-the-pack with other temples in our region regarding the cost of annual dues. I have to say that I was worried about the approval of the much needed and overdue increase. Naturally, nobody wants an increase in dues but, it's a necessary evil we must endure. It would be much easier on everyone if we take a small increase every 2 or 3 years instead of a big hit all at once. Over 60% of those in attendance voted to approve the increase.

A huge thumbs up to the Hungry 5 and DeMolay for stepping up to help Downriver For Veterans (DFV) with the cleanup of Oakwood Cemetery in Flat Rock last month. DeMolay had 10+ volunteers and helped with cutting down overgrown weeds, trees, cleaning headstones and placing flags on the graves of veterans, some dated back to the 1870's. The Hungry 5 provided 250 chlidogs with all the fixings and water to the hot, hungry workers. When I approached DeMolay at a parade regarding the opportunity, they responded yes before I could even finish my statement. Impressive young men.

The first meeting of the newly created Potentate's Unit will meet at the Shrine Center at 6:00 on Monday, September 16th in the Garden Room. All newly created Nobles from January 1st to the present are automatically a member of this unit. The purpose of this unit is to help new Nobles to become familiar with the Shrine, Shriners Hospitals for Children and meet other Nobles. There is no charge to belong to this unit and refreshments and light food will be provided. New Nobles from 2018 are also invited to attend if they wish.

Lastly, I again thank you for allowing me to serve Moslem as Assistant Rabban. Although it requires a lot of extra work and time, it is my absolute pleasure to serve the Nobility on the Divan. Feel free to contact me anytime with any questions you might have regarding the temple, events, etc. If all things stay on plan and schedule, I look forward to Imperial Sir Jim Smith's tag line – "Having Fun In 21".

CHILDCARE

Nashville, TN – Music City USA – home of the Tennessee Titans of the NFL and Nashville Predators of the NHL and host of the 145th Imperial Session.

With everybody arriving scattered over a three (3) day period; Friday, Saturday and Sunday, the Imperial Representative, Colorado Representatives and the Emeritus Representatives gathered together on Monday for the first day of the Imperial Session. The Imperial Work Session began at 8:30am. After parliamentary rules were established, and with 34 pieces of legislation before us, 20 for the Iowa Corporation and 14 for the Colorado Corporation, we went to work. The future of Shriners International was established by voting for the Imperial Officers for 2019 / 2020 as we voted for the new Imperial Divan with Imperial Sir Jeff Sowder voted in as Imperial Potentate and all current member moving up one position. Congratulations to Imperial Sir Larry Leib who was voted in as Imperial Marshall. New to the Imperial Divan is David Worel of Al Aska Temple – voted in as Imperial Outer Guard. Also voted in was Past Imperial Potentate Jim Cain to the position of Imperial Recorder.

One very important piece of legislation on the Iowa side was restoration of relations between the Grand Lodge of Arkansas and Shriners International. If you recall at the 139th Imperial Session in 2013, there was the “Arkansas Resolution.” Passage of this resolution in effect allowed a person in Arkansas to become a Shriner without the pre-requisite of being a Master Mason. The effect of the amendment – In the State of Arkansas, as long as the Imperial Potentate has certified that the Grand Lodge of Arkansas has taken action designed to suppress or proscribe the Order, temples may initiate individuals who are not Freemasons. With the passage of “Reversal of the Arkansas Resolution”, the effect of the amendment – A process would be adopted to start restoring the fraternal relationship between Shriners International and the Grand Lodge of Arkansas. The amendment passed unanimously.

On the Colorado side of business, item #25 – Acquisitions, Construction, Closing or relocating of Hospitals – the effect of this amendment if passed – Additional hospitals could be acquired or constructed and existing hospitals could be closed or relocated by the vote of the Members at an annual meeting or by the two-thirds (2/3) vote of the COMBINED bodies consisting of the Board of Directors, Board of Trustees AND the Board of Governors of the affected hospital or hospitals – the amendment was passed. Also on the hospital front, the following changes will occur: SHC Tampa & Twin Cities will become an outpatient care facilities and SHC Cincinnati will be partnering with Dayton Children’s Hospital.

With all legislation and reports completed on Thursday, it was time for the July 4th Fireworks over the city of Nashville, I must say a spectacular show. With the 145th Imperial Session now complete, it's time to complete the packing, load the bus and head home.

Before I conclude, I would like to extend special thanks to Jack and Bobby Hansen for the exceptional job they performed in taking care of the Hospitality Room.....THANK YOU.

The five (5) days spent in Nashville have been a very exciting time in my Shrine life. I have met many Shriners from across the country and have learned much during the sessions I have attended. I thank Illustrious Sir Jeff Geske for making me part of the Moslem contingent that came to Nashville for the 145th Imperial Sessions.

At the conclusion of the Imperial Session, Imperial Potentate Jeff Sowder meet with his Imperial Divan and the Board of Trustee, commonly referred to as the Joint Boards. It is at this meeting that the Imperial Potentate issues General Order #1 for his Imperial Year and notifies the Joint Boards of his Imperial Appointments. It was at this meeting that Imperial Potentate Jeff Sowder announced that he has selected me as one of the four (4) Committee Members for the Oversight Committee for Shriners Hospitals for Children. I am extremely honored to have been selected to Committee and look forward to the coming year of service.

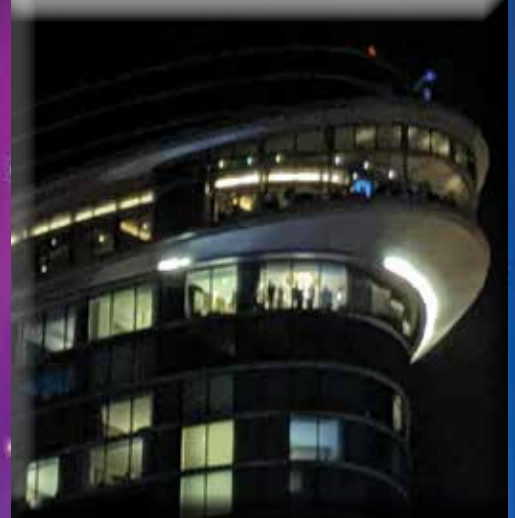

RETURNING THE FAVOR... WITH MIKE ROWE

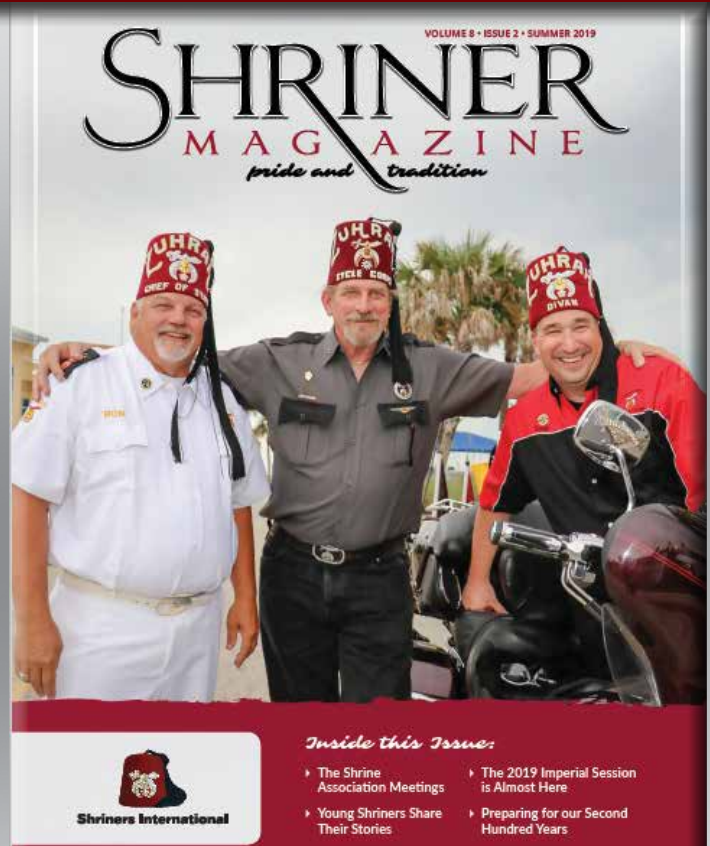

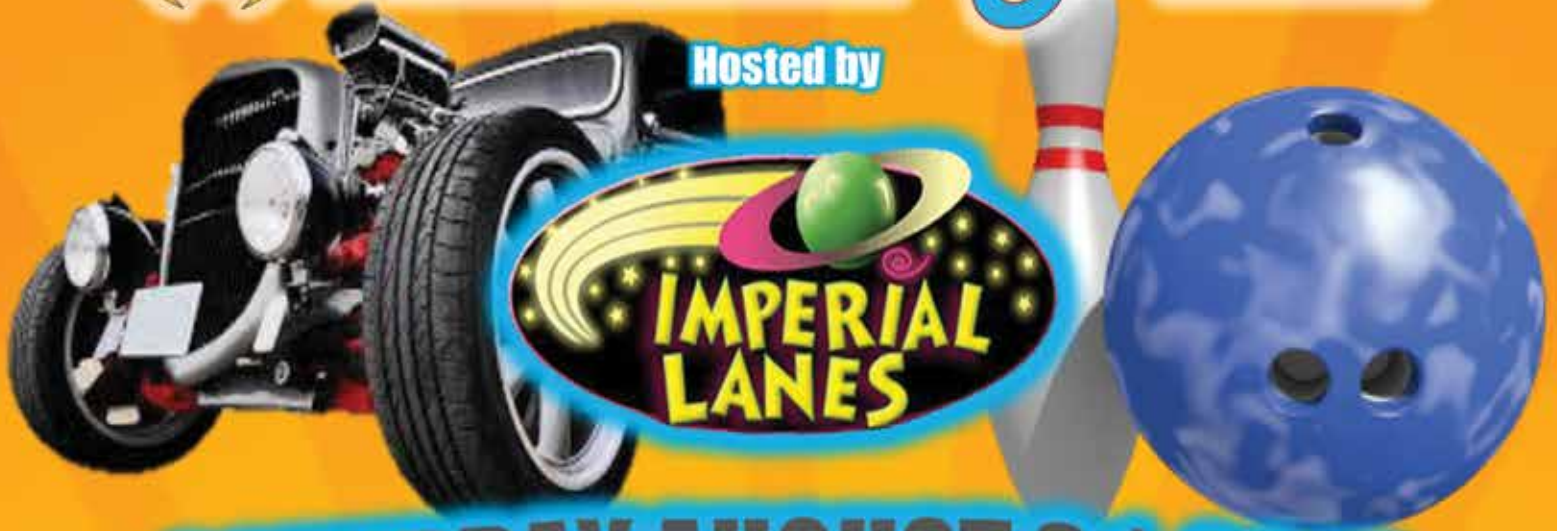
